SPENDING TIME IN THE WORD

God has made Himself known in Jesus Christ. The Bible is ultimately about Jesus. Therefore, we can know God through spending time in the Word.

KEY VERSE:

Matthew 4:4 - But he answered, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God."

THE BIBLE...

- Is a collection of 66 books (39 Old Testament and 27 New Testament)
- Was written by about 48 human authors over 1,500 years
- Has one Divine Author, the Holy Spirit, who superintended the process to tell one story - the story of God revealing Himself in Jesus Christ.

Robert Plummer says, "Each word of the Bible is the word of a conscious human author and at the same time the exact word that God intends for the revelation of himself.1" That is called inspiration.

One of the main reasons people struggle to read the Bible is because they don't know how to understand the Bible. We want to provide you with a simple, three-step guide for how to read and understand a passage you are reading: Bible, Gospel, Personal.	NOTES:
INTERPRETING THE BIBLE: Bible - What is this passage about? Here are some questions that can help you get there • Who are the main characters? • What is their situation?	
Gospel - What does this have to do with Jesus? Here are some questions that can help you get there • Where does this fit into the big story of the Bible? • How does this passage highlight elements of the gospel (i.e. God's holiness, sin, faith, atonement, etc.)? • Are there any characters that show us what Christ is like or any who are a clear contrast to Christ?	
Personal - What does this have to do with me? Here are some questions that can help you get there • How may God want me to apply this passage? • How should I imitate the characters in this passage? • How can I learn from their mistakes?

DIG DEEPER: SPENDING TIME IN THE WORD

GETTING STARTED:

Sometimes it can be hard to know where to start when it comes to reading the Bible. Check out some of these reading plans and tools that can help you take your next step.

BIBLE READING PLANS:

The One Year Bible Plan - Read the Bible in a year through daily readings from the Old Testament, New Testament, Psalms, and Proverbs.

52 Week Bible Reading Plan - Read the Bible in a year, with each day of the week dedicated to a different genre: Epistles, The Law, History, Psalms, Poetry, Prophecy, and the Gospels.

Two-Year Bible Reading Plan - Read the Old and New Testaments once, and Psalms & Proverbs four times.

TOOLS:

- A Bible

- Bible App (YouVersion, ESV, CSB, etc.)
- RightNow Media: get started at libertylive.church/rightnow.

TIPS:

- Schedule some time in your day to spend in the Word.
- Get alone with God, remove distractions, your phone, tv, etc.

GATHER TOGETHER

KEY VERSES:

Acts 2:46-47 - So continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved.

Acts 5:42 - And daily in the temple, and in every house, they did not cease teaching and preaching Jesus as the Christ.

We see in these verses that the church had both large and small gatherings, and our vision involves both! We meet together for worship in a large gathering on Sundays and in small gatherings in our groups throughout the week. Groups are a huge part of our vision. GROW TOGETHER

The reality is that people gather all the time - at work, school, sports, restaurants, etc. So, what is unique about a church gathering? What makes the gathering of believers unique is the purpose behind our gathering. We gather with intentionality to help one another grow.

E.S.P.N.

The way groups grow together at Liberty is through E.S.P.N. We want all groups to:

- E | Encourage: encourage each other
- S | Scripture: spend time in God's Word together
- P | Pray: spend time in prayer and pray for each other
- N | Next Step: help each other take our next step of faith

KEY VERSES:

Ecclesiastes 4:9 - Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor; If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up.

Your community is there to help you grow and walk through life's ups and downs with you. Authentic relationships are found in groups. You're not meant to do life alone!

Hebrews 10:24-25 - And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the day approaching.

DIG DEEPER: GROW TOGETHER

Pastor Grant says, "You can't grow spiritually unless you are connected relationally." How have you experienced that to be true in your life?	INTIMIDATION Many are scared to find community. Going to a stranger's house with new people and having personal conversations with them can be intimidating, so they never try it.
What are some excuses that you, or people in general, use that keep you from joining a group?	ISSUES Some people have relational hurts and struggles they carry with them from their past, while others have secret sin in their life and don't want to open up to others. Either way, various life issues keep them from wanting to find community.
MY EXCUSES:	INTERESTS
1.	Many people have so many different interests they're committed to. They spread themselves thin, with no margin left in their schedule, so they don't make time for community.
2.	KEY VERSES Proverbs 27:17 - As iron sharpens iron, so one person
3.	sharpens another.
Some common excuses that people have for not finding community include:	Galatians 6:2 - Bear one another's burdens and so fulfill the law of Christ.
IGNORANCE Many people simply don't realize their need for meaningful community.	1 Corinthians 12:21, 27 - The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!" And the head cannot say to the feet, "I don't need you!"Now you are the body of Christ, and each of you is a part of it.
INDEPENDENT Many people don't believe they need community. They are under the delusion that they can navigate the Christian life on their own, even though the Bible tells us otherwise.	What do these verses teach us about overcoming these excuses and the importance of finding community?
INTROVERT Many people use their personality as an excuse. They may feel like they aren't outgoing enough to really connect with others.

SERVE PEOPLE

We were made for relationships and finding community! For community to work and accomplish its purpose, the members have to participate. They have to use their God-given gifts. We glorify God when we use the abilities and talents that He has given us to bless and serve others. There are two big ways to serve people: by loving the church and loving the community.

LOVE THE CHURCH

KEY VERSES:

1 Peter 4:10-11 - Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in various forms.

1 Corinthians 12:4-5 - Now there are different gifts, but the same Spirit. There are different ministries, but the same Lord.

DISCOVERING YOUR GIFTS:

As you are deciding where and how you should serve, one of the most important things to do is consider your spiritual gifts. God has given us each unique gifts and abilities! You can discover your spiritual gifts with our online spiritual gifts survey.

JOIN THE LIFE TEAM

The Life Team is what we call the group of people at Liberty who are using their gifts to serve people here at our church! Once you discover your gifts, we want you to join the Life Team and know that you were made to impact others through serving!

Body parts are meant to complete and not compete. How should that principle shape the way we approach serving? What are the dangers of serving out of a spirit of competition?	TWO EXTREMES TO AVOID: There are two extremes to avoid: believing that the supernatural gifts (tongues and healing) have completely ceased or believing that they are normative for most, if not every, believer. While godly Christians can hold either view, we take a different approach here at Liberty. The first is a non-biblical restriction of the gifts. The second is a non-biblical exaltation of the gifts. While we don't regularly practice the supernatural gifts at Liberty, we serve through the same Spirit who empowered Christians in the book of Acts. We frequently hear stories of how God is working supernaturally through His people, especially from our missionaries. Ultimately, we don't believe in a day of miracles but in a God of miracles. What is your next step in serving people by loving the church?

GO ON THE MISSION

Our mission is all about changing lives, communities, and the world for Jesus Christ.

KEY VERSE:

Matthew 28: 18-20 - And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

GO TO OUR NEIGHBORS

God intentionally puts people in your circle of influence to show them the love of Jesus. Your nextdoor neighbors, co-workers, hairdresser, and barista at the coffee shop are not coincidentally in your life. God has placed them there purposefully and it's important to realize that God wants to use you to make a difference in their lives by sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ with them. Together we can make a difference in the lives of every person we come into contact with. We are called to leave a legacy in Hampton Roads by going to our neighbors.

GO TO THE NATIONS

God has also given us the Great Commission (Matt. 28:18-20) to take the gospel to people who have no access to the good news of Jesus Christ. There are over 2 billion people who have no access to the gospel! We must take the gospel to people who don't even have the Bible in their own language and may have never heard the name of Jesus. Together we can leave a legacy in our world by serving God among the nations whether it's on a trip that is one week, one month, one year, or maybe even answering the calling to a lifetime of gospel service to the nations. At Liberty, we are thankful to be changing the world for Jesus Christ through our long-term partnerships in West Africa, Northern Africa, East Africa, The Middle East, The Amazon, El Salvador, and the Navajo Nation. We want to encourage you to leave a legacy by going to the nations.

GIVE TO THE MISSION

KEY VERSE:

2 Corinthians 8:2-5 - During a severe trial brought about by affliction, their abundant joy and their extreme poverty overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. I can testify that, according to their ability and even beyond their ability, of their own accord, they begged us earnestly for the privilege of sharing in the ministry to the saints, and not just as we had hoped. Instead, they gave themselves first to the Lord and then to us by God's will.

Giving your life to God results in a life of generosity. Generosity is who God is. For God so loved the world that He gave (John 3:16). God is the greatest giver, and if we are going to be like Him, then we must imitate His generosity. Here at Liberty, we have outlined a generosity pathway that helps us follow Jesus in giving. DIG DEEPER: GENEROSITY PATHWAY

STARTING GIVER

BEGINNING TO LIVE A LIFE OF GENEROSITY: We all start our journey toward generosity somewhere. For many, they have simply never given to God's mission through their local church. The first step is creating a budget in order to effectively manage their money, which creates margin to give. We recommend the EveryDollar app to get started in managing your resources for Christ.

STEADY GIVER

CONSISTENTLY LIVING A LIFE OF GENEROSITY: God's generosity towards us isn't random. His love and generosity for us is steady. Therefore, starting givers should continue towards consistent generosity. This means prioritizing generosity in your budget. For many at Liberty, this step involves setting up monthly recurring gifts online at libertylive.church/give.

SCRIPTURAL GIVER

LIVING A BIBLICAL LIFE OF GENEROSITY: As we give consistently, we also begin to give proportionally. God isn't impressed with the total sum we give, but He does want us to give in proportion to how He has given to us. The Scriptural giver prioritizes 10% of their income to giving to God's mission through the local church.

SACRIFICIAL GIVER

LIVING A SELFLESS LIFE OF GENEROSITY: God's generosity towards us cost Him greatly. King David once asked, "How can I give something to God that costs me nothing?" (2 Samuel 24:24). Sacrificial giving moves beyond a focus on the minimum. Imitating God's generosity will involve sacrificing something in the present to invest into eternity.

SUPERNATURAL GIVER

LIVING TO LEAVE A LEGACY OF GENEROSITY: As we give sacrificially, God may lead us to give beyond what seems humanly possible. That was the testimony of the widow in 1 Kings 17 and the Christians in 2 Corinthians 8. However, God is faithful to supply our needs as we prioritize His kingdom above all things.





HOW YOU CAN KNOW GOD

PERSONAL RELATIONSHIP WITH JESUS.

You were made to know God. He is personal and relational, and He wants a relationship with you! He has made Himself known through Jesus. So how can you know God? The Bible tells us we can know God through FAITH. Each letter in the word "FAITH" helps us understand how we can know God.

F | FORGIVENESS

We cannot have a relationship with God unless we experience God's forgiveness. Why? Everyone has sinned and needs God's forgiveness.

For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God - Romans 3:23.

This means me, this means you, this means everyone! God's forgiveness is in Jesus only.

In Him (meaning Jesus) we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses (sin)...

- Ephesians 1:7

A | AVAILABLE

What is available? Forgiveness is available! God's forgiveness is available for all of us.

Jesus said, "God so loved the world in this way: He gave His One and Only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life." – John 3:16.

God's forgiveness is available for all of us, but it is not automatic.

Jesus said, "Not everyone who says to Me, `Lord, Lord!' will enter the Kingdom of Heaven." - Matthew 7:21

I | IMPOSSIBLE

According to the Bible, it is impossible for us to get to Heaven on our own, by our good deeds, or even by living a good life.

For by grace you are saved through FAITH, and this is not from yourselves; it is God's gift - not from works, so that no one can boast. - Ephesians 2:8-9

If we cannot get to heaven on our own, by our good deeds, or by living a good life, then how can a sinful person like you or me have eternal life and enter heaven?

T | TURN

Suppose you are going down a road and someone says to you, "Stop! Turn!", what would that person be asking you to do? To change direction/go a new route. In the Bible the word, "turn" is the word "repent." To repent means to change direction or to go a new way. We must make a turn in our lives. We must turn away from our sin and self.

Jesus said, "Unless you repent (turn from your sin and self), you will all likewise perish." - Luke 13:3

We must turn to the Savior. Trust Jesus only as your Savior and Lord. The Bible makes it very clear that there are not many ways to heaven, but only one way to heaven, through Jesus.

Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." - John 14:6 Here is the greatest news of all for our lives.

If you confess with your mouth, `Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved...with the mouth one confesses, resulting in salvation." - Romans 10:9-10

What happens if a person is willing to repent of their sins and confess "Jesus is Lord"?

H | HEAVEN

Heaven is a place where we will live with God forever in the hereafter. Listen to Jesus' promise to you:

Jesus said, "If I go away and prepare a place for you, I will come back and receive you to Myself, so that where I am you may be also." - John 14:3

You can have heaven beginning here. Eternal life begins now with Jesus.

Jesus said, "I have come that they may have life and have it in abundance." - John 10:10

The letter "H" also stands for how. The question is this: How can a person have God's forgiveness and eternal life in heaven? The answer is simple: if you will turn away from you sin and self and trust Jesus to forgive your sins, and make Him the Leader and Savior of your life.

Would you like to receive this forgiveness and trust in Jesus as personal Savior and Leader of your life? Right now you can start a relationship with God. You can choose to pray right now and ask Jesus to forgive your sin and take control of your life. Pray this prayer by faith.

Jesus, I know I am a sinner and I ask for your forgiveness. I believe that You are God and You died on the cross to pay for my sins and rose from the dead. Help me to turn from my ways and start living life Your way, be the Leader and Savior of my life. Thank you for loving me. Amen.

BAPTISM

IMMERSION

Jesus was baptized "in the Jordan" river and "came up out of the water" (Mark 1:9-10). The Gospel of John says that John the Baptist chose where to baptize based on the fact that there was "much water there" (John 3:23). These descriptions fit immersion as opposed to sprinkling.


IDENTIFICATION

Baptism is all about identifying with Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection. When we go under the water we identify with His death and show our faith in His death for our sins. When we come out of the water we identify with His resurrection and show our faith in His resurrection. It is a way of publically saying, "I am not ashamed to follow Jesus." (Rom. 6:4)

IMMEDIATE

In the book of Acts, when people responded to the gospel they would immediately follow in believer's baptism (Acts 2:41, 8:36, & 16:33). Now, that doesn't mean that it is a requirement to be baptized immediately, but it does mean that the only prerequisite to baptism is true faith in Jesus Christ. Baptism is the first major step of obedience as we repent and believe in the gospel, not something we work up to when we become more mature in Christ.

Baptism is an outward expression of inward change.
