Hi Leaders!

Welcome to your Let's Get Started Leader Guide. Our prayer for this class is to help those who are seeking, new believers, or those returning to take their next step in their faith journey.

Let's Get Started is designed to open conversations each week on some of the most foundational building blocks of faith in Jesus. Our desire is for the meetings each week to be very conversational, where anyone can ask questions. Because of that, we'll do our best to help equip you in this guide, but you can always reach out to your campus pastor or director if you need any assistance.

The sections just for leaders will be throughout this guidebook in black squares, or a black page similar to this one. In these sections, you'll see things to share with the group, questions you may get, and more. The rest of the book will be what the learners are seeing each week.

We're praying for you as you start this journey!

Now, let's get started...

LEADER NOTES: INTRO WEEK

We're kicking off our group with an Introduction Week. We'll meet each other, do a Course Overview section, and work on a Spiritual Story activity. We're asking you to share your Spiritual Story this week, which will also help encourage others to share throughout the weeks.

You'll want to create a group roster with everyone's name and contact information. Focus on building relationships with and between your group and getting to know their stories.

Encourage your group to begin processing any questions they may have about who God is and what it means to be in a relationship with Him. This group is designed to meet people where they're at and help them take their next (or first) step of faith!

COURSE OVERVIEW

Welcome to "Let's Get Started", a 9-week course with video teaching and discussion, designed to give you an encouraging space to talk about who God is and what having a relationship with Jesus really means. It's designed to be a safe space where no question is off the table and anyone is welcome!

LEADER NOTE:

Please introduce yourselves & then have group members introduce themselves.

Opening Question: What led you to be a part of this group?

This course is a place to explore faith and experience community. The success of this group depends on your participation. The group is designed to be conversational, not a lecture. Over the next 8 weeks, we will have 8 specific conversations:

- A Conversation About God
- A Conversation About Us
- A Conversation About Eternity
- A Conversation About Salvation
- A Conversation About the Bible
- A Conversation About Prayer
- A Conversation About Community
- A Conversation About My Next Step

Each week includes a 10-12 minute teaching video followed by 45-60 minutes of a guided discussion. We will close each week in a time of prayer.





LEADER NOTE:

We would love for each group participant to share their spiritual story one week (5 minutes or less). To help you with this, we have an activity we are going to do right now. Complete the "My Spiritual Story" Activity in your Learner Guide.

Q: What questions do you all have about this group?

Next week, we will begin with "A Conversation About God". We will talk about what God is like and the difference between being religious vs. having a relationship with God. Let's close in prayer.

LEADER NOTES: SESSION I

A CONVERSATION ABOUT GOD

As we begin our conversation weeks, we want to give you some questions that may come up during your group time.

Common Questions You May Get:

Q: How can God be three persons at one time?

A: That's a great question. God is Father, Son, and Spirit. This is one of the great mysteries of the faith. We know that it's true because the Bible makes it clear over and over again, but we can't fully understand how it works. One of the greatest proofs of the reality of God is that there's much about Him we can't understand. Isaiah 55:8 tells us that "His thoughts are not our thoughts, and His ways are not our ways."

Q: How can I trust God if I don't fully understand Him?

A: There are lots of things in life that we trust but don't completely understand. To trust God is to have faith in God. Faith is defined as "trustor confidence in something or someone." When you sit in a chair for the first time you are showing faith that the chair will hold you. Until you sit, you really don't know if the chair will stay together. We trust God based on His history, character, and promises. Over time, as you grow closer tomGod, trusting Him will become more natural.

Q: I don't have a good relationship with my father, so how am I am supposed to trust God as a father?

A: Sometimes, our experience with our biological father doesn't match up well with the standard that God sets, and that can be really difficult. God models the role of "father" as it should be, not the other way around. God is the father who loves fully and unconditionally. He will never leave, and He will always forgive. He builds up, equips, frees, and empowers. God sets the standard for fatherhood. The critical thing to remember is that God was the first Father, and He always fills that role perfectly.

Video Notes:

SESSION 1 A CONVERSATION ABOUT GOD



This week, we're talking about who God is. There is nothing more important than knowing God. God is personal, powerful, and perfect. He wants to have a relationship with you.

We see the personal aspect of God in the Trinity - the Father, the Son (Jesus), and the Holy Spirit. The Father loves us and created us, the Son (Jesus) lived among us and died for our sins and rose again, and the Holy Spirit dwells within us. He comforts us. He leads and guides us. These are not three gods, but one God in three persons, showing how God relates to us.

There is nothing God cannot do. He is all-powerful. God spoke the world into existence. He created everything, and He also sustains all things.

God is also perfect. Because He is perfect, we can trust Him completely. We can be sure that His promises are true. In a sinful and uncertain world, we can still know that God is good. He is faithful and never-changing, and He loves you.

LEADER NOTE:

The material covered in this group can potentially lead to lengthy or off topic discussions. Try to acknowlege their question and guide the discussion back to the topic when those instances arise. Offer to talk outside of the group to continue any helpful conversations that didn't fit within this week's group.

A CONVERSATION ABOUT US

Common Questions You May Get:


Q: Does God still love us when we mess up?

A: Yes! Romans 5:8 says that "God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Think about that for a moment. God loves us so much that even while we were doing wrong, He sent His only Son to die on a cross so that we could be forgiven and free. That's how much He still loves us when we mess up. His love is unconditional!

Q: I want to do right, but I keep sinning. Is being a "good Christian" supposed to be this hard?

A: None of us are perfect. Jesus lived the only perfect life that the world has ever seen. We should always strive to be like Jesus, but it's a process, and sometimes we will fall short. Every Christian struggles and is faced with temptation and difficulty, but there are practical steps we can take to help us. Find an accountability partner, make spending time in the Word a habit, and pray regularly. As you grow, you'll find your walk with the Lord feels more and more natural as you move forward on your journey of faith. Keep going!

Video Notes:



Who are we? What is our purpose? These are all questions you may have heard or even asked yourself. This week we've been having a conversation about who we are as humans.

Today we learned about three truths:

- 1. All people are created by God.
- 2. All people are broken by sin.
- 3. All people can be restored.

When God created everything, He created humans. He made us in His image (Genesis 1:26-27). We have intrinsic value given by God. He created each of us, and gave us the ability to make our own choices.

The first humans God created, Adam and Eve, started in a perfect relationship with God, but they ended up choosing to walk outside God's plan for them by doing the one thing He asked them not to do (Genesis 3). Because of this, sin entered the world and we were separated from God.

But it doesn't end there! We all have the opportunity to be restored back to God, He made a way for us to be right with Him.

A CONVERSATION ABOUT ETERNITY

Common Questions You May Get:

Q: Is there suffering in Heaven?

A: No. Heaven is the place of perfect happiness; it holds no fear, sorrow, or pain.


Q: Is Jesus the only way to Heaven?

A: In John 14:6, Jesus says that "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." Jesus is the only way to Heaven. He lived, died, and rose again so that everyone could have a path to freedom and salvation through Him.

Q: Is Hell real?

A: There is a Heaven and a Hell. The Scriptures don't leave any gray area here. The important thing to remember about Hell is that God doesn't send anyone there. In fact, He sent His only Son to live a sinless life and die on a cross to make sure that no one had to go to Hell. Hell is a place where people can pay their own debt if they want to, but nobody has to. Jesus has paid it. It's done. All that's required of us is to turn and accept His sacrifice on our behalf.



Video Notes:



Something within us longs for more than this world offers. We were created to have a relationship with God and spend eternity with Him.



Heaven is an incredible place that God has prepared for everyone who has placed their faith in Jesus. Our human minds cannot begin to understand what it will be like, but we know there will be no more sickness, pain, or death (Revelation 21:4).

Hell is an eternal place of torment, separated from the presence of God. Scripture tells us that the payment of sin is death. That death is eternal separation from God. But God is so loving, He sent his son Jesus to this earth and He died on the cross to set us free. Whoever calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved. Hell doesn't have to be our destiny, because Jesus has already done everything necessary for us to receive eternal life in heaven. He offers it to anyone who believes.

A CONVERSATION ABOUT SALVATION

Common Questions You May Get:


Q: What can I do to earn God's love and approval?

A: Nothing. You don't have to earn it and you wouldn't be able to even if you tried. Fortunately, you can just receive it. Ephesians 2:8 tells us that "by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God." You don't have to do anything except put your faith in Jesus to receive God's love and approval.

Q: Why does God love us so much?

A: He chooses to - He freely loves us. More than a feeling, love is a choice. The Word tells us in 1 John 4:8 that God is love, so He is really the embodiment of that choice in action. It's even more beautiful when we understand that God isn't forced to love us because of a feeling. He chooses to love us, unconditionally and always, out of His own free will.

Video Notes:



In the past weeks, we've been having conversations about God, humanity, and eternity. We've talked about sin and that the payment for sin is death. But we also know that God did not leave us without hope, He loves us and wants a relationship with us. We do this through salvation. Salvation is a gift from God, received through faith, not by our efforts.

Salvation means being saved from sin and its consequences. It's about being rescued from a life separated from God and being given the gift of eternal life with Him. Our best efforts will never, no matter how noble, be able to bridge the gap between our sinful nature and God's holiness. This is only possible because of Jesus Christ. Jesus died on the cross, taking the payment of all our sins upon Himself. Three days later, He rose again!

Jesus, through His death and resurrection, has paved the way out of the darkness of sin. When we trust in Him and follow His guidance, we move from being lost to being found, from darkness to light, and from death to eternal life.


LEADER NOTES: **SESSION 5**

A CONVERSATION ABOUT THE BIBLE

Common Questions You May Get:

- Q: What is the Bible?
 - A: The Bible is the living Word of God, and is our guidebook to life. 2 Timothy 3:16-17 says it best, "The whole Bible was given to us by inspiration from God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives; it straightens us out and helps us do what is right. It is God's way of making us well prepared at every point, fully equipped to do good to everyone."
- Q: How do I get more from my Bible?
 A: There are three great steps to take towards getting the most out of your Bible. First, accept its authority by receiving God's Word with an open heart and respond to His Word with obedience. Second, absorb its truths by hearing, reading, studying, memorizing, and meditating on God's Word. Third, apply its principles. James 1:22 tells us plainly, "Do not merely listen to the Word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says."
- Q: Why are there different versions/translations of the Bible? A: The Bible was originally written in ancient Greek and Hebrew. Different translations exist because language is alive, constantly developing and changing. The truths in God's Word stay the same, but the words we use to communicate them effectively change along with the language. In the King James Version, you find a lot of "thees and thous." Those are fine, and accurate, but they aren't words we use anymore. The different versions of the bible are all just trying to communicate the exact same truths in ways that match up well with our modern language.
- Q: What is the difference between the Old and New Testament? The Old Testament is the foundation. The New Testament is the fulfilment. God made promises in the Old Testament and keeps His promises in the New Testament. The Old Testament is about God making the world. The New Testament is about God saving the world. God's people in the Old Testament were Israel. God's people in the New Testament are the Church.



Video Notes:



The word "Bible" comes from the Latin word "biblica," which means books or library. The Bible is a collection of 66 books in a variety of genres (history, poetry, prophecy, and even personal letters).

The books of the Bible are organized into two main parts—the Old Testament, which covers human history prior to Jesus's birth, and the New Testament, which tells the story of Jesus and the early church and looks ahead to eternity.



In total, the entire Bible was written over 1,500 years by almost 40 different authors. And yet, it tells one unified story. The story of God's plan to rescue people from sin and reunite us to Himself.

A CONVERSATION ABOUT PRAYER

Common Questions You May Get:

Q: Why doesn't God answer all of our prayers?

A: He does! Sometimes we get stuck on the idea that "yes" is the only answer that counts. God may answer with "not right now," or "I have something better for you." Often, when we look back over time, we are able to see how God was moving and realize His plan was better, and although He removed an opportunity, or closed a door, it ended up leading us to more joy, freedom, and life.


Q: How often should we pray?

A: 1 Thessalonians 5 gives us an answer. It says, "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." Essentially, pray anytime there's an opportunity — no matter where you are or what you're doing. Use every occasion, every season, and every possible moment to pray. It doesn't have to be formal. Make talking with God a part of your everyday habits.

Q: What is God's will?

It is the Father's will to see the lost saved and the saved become whole, healthy, and successful in all areas of life — spiritually, mentally, emotionally, physically, and financially. He wills that the whole then be equipped, and the equipped be sent out to spread the gospel to the nations.

Video Notes:



Prayer is talking with God. It is a two-way conversation. Both talking to God and listening to Him is present in prayer. It can be audible, silent, private, or public. God cares about every detail of your life. You can always talk to God.

Think of your closest relationships. If you never communicated with them, you wouldn't know them very well. The same goes with our relationship with God. We talk to God through prayer, and we primarily listen to God through His Word, the Bible. Jesus taught the disciples how to pray, and He showed us the importance of prayer by taking time Himself to pray.

If we want to grow in our relationship with God, we have to spend time with Him.

Common Questions You May Get:


Q: How do I find community?
A: Join a group, serve on the Life Team!

Q: What do I tell people who knew the "old me"?
A: Just be honest. Your story of life change can have a tremendous impact on the people in your sphere of influence. You can tell them that God has changed you on the inside. Some people will understand, some won't. Remember 1 Corinthians 1:18, which says, "For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God."

Q: Why do I need to forgive someone when they are the ones that wronged me?

In order to experience the fruit of our own forgiveness, we need to forgive others. Forgiving others allows us to overcome feelings of anger, bitterness, and revenge. Forgiveness can heal spiritual wounds and bring the peace and love that only God can give.

We need one another! 58 times the Bible says "one another". The Bible tells us to love one another, greet one another, care for one another, encourage one another, bear one another's burdens, strengthen one another, serve one another, forgive one another, pray for one another.

Jesus, God in flesh – had community. He had community with 12 men He called His apostles. He had community with his inner circle of Peter, James, and John. He even had a form of community with the large crowds. If Jesus needed community, then you and I need community! We will never grow in isolation.

We gather together in community in large groups as the Church and in small groups with other people so we can do 3 things:

- 1. Grow Together
- 2. Worship Together
- 3. Encourage One Another


Hi Leaders!

SESSION 8 A CONVERSATION ABOUT NEXT STEPS

Today we've been talking about next steps in our walk with God. Taking the next step mostly means incorporating spiritual disciplines in your life. We should live with Jesus as the center of our home life, work life, play life, community life, and private life. As you consider your next step for spiritual growth, ask yourself the question, "What one thing in my spiritual journey, if it improved, would make the most difference?" Perhaps it is studying the Bible consistently, praying daily, or joining a group.



Some next steps are one-time occasions such as the first time you place your faith in Jesus or baptism. If you have not taken these next steps, that is a great place to start. Having said this, most next steps are habits that enrich our spiritual lives. We call these spiritual disciplines. Examples include Bible study, meditation, prayer, fasting, giving, witnessing, slowing and sabbath, solitude, service, worship, celebration, confession, guidance, and even suffering.

God has given us spiritual disciplines to receive His grace and blessing. It is the inner work of transforming from the inside out as our heart, mind, and soul prioritize loving God above all else.
